Call to Order: Andrea Szego

- Acceptance of the Agenda
- Acceptance of the minutes from the April 2018 meeting
- Guest Speaker Michelle Aarts, Parent Involvement Advisory Committee (also running for School Trustee this year)
 - 12 advisory committees at TDSB
 - PIAC all parent-driven, all representatives are parents
 - 2 reps/ward, ideally 44 members
 - PIAC advocates for parent involvement in education system
 - o advocates to board on behalf of parents and families
 - o for more communication and access to resources
 - PIAC has worked on website to make TDSB info easier to find (TDSB website has been hard to navigate)
 - advocated for and had approved that TDSB add "parent tab" to their website to make it easier to navigate
 - this ward is missing parents; trying to drum it up
 - launching "welcome back" pack for councils in the fall
 - PIAC gets most of its work done in working groups (mostly done via teleconference)
 - 3rd Tuesday of every month at board office for main meetings open to all
 - looking to use webcast features board is currently installing
 - usually hold parents' conference in fall, School Council appreciation dinner in February
 - involved in TSDB's big parenting conference in April
 - Sheila Cary-Meagher holds the election for PIAC members from the ward
 - just issued new templates for bylaws and new toolkit for councils
 - Facebook page for this ward
 - Wards can join together their PRO grants... Ward 10 just did fantastic futures website. up to \$30K for ward-wide grant. Our ward has never had one

- PIAC funds fall conference from regional PRO grant
- Toronto Ward 16 Facebook group; calendar can be used by all councils
- would like to see more networking within the ward on a parent-level (principals already networking)
- time requirement is must make monthly meetings, and join 1 working group

- ask nominees to email intent as well as return form
- 2 weeks of notice required; will post now, elections will happen end of first meeting
- Maybe more educational materials required about roles
- We should elect to general council, then roles are decided amongst council; not directly elected
- Soft date of Wed., Sept. 26 for first meeting
- nomination forms, role descriptions will go out first week with kids Andrea will not run again

8. September Fundraisers

- maybe sponsor x-country kids as fundraiser?
- EH t-shirts/hoodies? get colour approval from Mr. Taylor
- selling food before curriculum night pre-register for pizza electronically?
- Mabel's/Oliver's Labels?
- Andrea will organize a pre-curriculum night meal, but nothing else (will advise if help wanted)
- coordinator for pumpkin patch required
- welcome back coffee
- vast majority at meeting indicated they would by tshirts
- hat production lead time was 4-6 weeks
- start collecting clothing orders on curriculum night let people know ahead of time so they can be prepared to buy
- people respond better when they know exactly how the funds will be spent
- Stephanie will investigate shirts

9. Post-Mortem on the Year

- fewer events, but bigger -- ie Pumpkin Patch, cupcakes, festival, Hullabaloo
- Which was better? More small events or less bigger ones?
- smaller events require smaller committees; more smaller events may attract more new volunteers
- 3 movie nights were done 2 years ago do movie nights during standard time so it's dark at night
- our events should build community
- Could we assign events to grade groups? So to target more parents
- we need to find a way to attract more volunteers and especially engage parents of older students
- 20% of the volunteers do 80% of the work
- cautioning towards divisive groupings (by grades)
- tie event to funds for their group; so junior movie night funds would support grade 8 grad
- parent fatigue by the time kids are in older grades
- think about it over the summer
- Many parents are in 2-working parents families, etc.. Physically can not volunteer

10. Playground

- meeting again Friday
- the possibility of an addition has stalled plans
- Mr. McLachlan is leaving, what is he leaving behind for new admin?
- if we're not going to do the work due to uncertainties, we shouldn't launch a big fundraiser
- we should still be able to do the work along Curry Ave.; can't imagine any addition would affect that
- maybe we split the process into smaller bites so we can work around the uncertainties
- Mr. McLachlan isn't told about planning decisions; planning department works with census data, etc.. He doesn't believe
 there will be more than 4 portables.
- field refurbishment is on agenda
- playground organization committee is open to new members

- final report! Thanks everyone! Heartening to see core group come out regularly
- Jump Rope for Heart raised \$12,000! Goal was 3K or 8K, can't remember. 1K came back to school; will probably go to playground
- Kindergarten open house was held; bags were distributed, costs school money
- volunteer tea; more student volunteer servers than volunteer recipients
 - o bad timing, late invites, if morning event, volunteers could go to work late, maybe a recognition instead of a tea
- platinum eco audit happened; haven't received accreditation yet
- students are showing a greater amount of care for school; reporting issues
- 2 classrooms will be painted over summer
- big hole in boys washroom to move new boiler piece in that wouldn't fit through doors
- will move to gas-fired boilers rather than steam plant; steam plant requires specialist caretaker
- got portable drawings; will make pinwheel arrangement -- they will step on baseball diamond
- one LTO and permanent teacher left to hire
- Tuesday grad, Wednesday reports, Thursday last day of school
- teacher assignments will be announced with reports
- Pride Flag up since June 1; board-wide, distributed to all schools, mini pride display in garden
- Rainbow Club arranging an assembly, but likely will happen next year
- Track and Field was great; in process of purchasing boring stuff and ipads and computers and furniture for growing/changing student population
- 26 grade 8 grads; Danforth Bowl opening just for them
