## **1. Welcoming Remarks and Land Acknowledgement**

.1 We are now allowed to record the meetings so that parents/caregivers that cannot attend can listen to the meeting afterwards.

## **2. School Update – Eleni Burke-Tsakmakas**

1. Report Cards went home today, parent teacher interviews this week
2. Library Resources in to sort out old material from an equity lens, opening up the space, make it more user friendly, reviewing where there are gaps in the collection,
3. Outdoor Learning Continues: working with three of our teachers, that will then serve as instructors for the rest of the school/staff
4. Facilities update: Accessibility project will be finished by December. Will involve some renovation to the upstairs bathroom. Repairs to washroom doors will hopefully happen at the same time as the accessibility updates.
5. Heating project is almost finished.
6. Trees: Two trees lost that were surrounded by pavement. Two new trees were replanted but not in the same place. School is also slotted to receive 7 more trees planted this year
7. Playground is now complete. Filling up the wood chips. Tether ball has been purchased to put on the pavement. Working on getting games in all the various zones so that there are activities to keep kids engaged in all the “zones”

### Other Updates - Jackilyn Wallace

1. Reminder to please stay outside the gate during pick up and drop off
2. Have now received most of our tech devices back that were loaned to other schools during the beginning of the pandemic. They are still trickling in slowly.
3. Special education – meeting took place on the 15<sup>th</sup> another meeting is on the 29<sup>th</sup> , Nov 19 is the last day of cognitive testing for the grade 3s
4. School Improvement plan: takes the format of 3 goals: Equity, Achievement, Well-being. Do have all the goals set out. But always happy to get feedback and suggestions. Very similar to last year, with a few minor changes to wording. Maybe next time we could leave some time to discuss.

### Staff Equity Update – Lydia Bracht

1. Teacher training is happening next week (half day) - Dr. Gholy Muhammad – using framework and 5 categories from her book: Identity, Skills, Criticality, Intellectualism, and Joy  
- Proudest Blue book that is being used as a way to explore the 5 categories
2. Trying to connect more with the school community around the Equity goals that are being worked on in the classroom, teachers will be sharing what they are working on with their students in the classroom with parents.
3. **Treasury Update** – No Treasurers at the meeting tonight /Polly reviewed
  - No changes since last month
  - \$9, 464.00 Balance
  - Vote for \$100 teacher gifts to use in their classrooms: passed unanimously
  - Vote for \$20/ per graduating student 36 Grade 8 and 24 for grade 5 French ( $\pm$  \$1,200): passed unanimously

**4. Clothing Library – Tanya**

1. Polly and Tanya – went through all the existing clothing. Good amount of clothing. Only two things we are low on: waterproof gloves and neck warmers.
2. Clothing is arranged in bins on lower level in the cafeteria area. It is open and ready to be used.

**7. Lunch**

- Parent question: How many supervisors are there per classroom? It is currently not one to one but the school is doing there best to get a close as possible to one to one ratio.
- Parent noted that their child got in trouble the other day for talking during lunch but that it seems difficult to expect a group of grade 3/4 children not to talk, if they are not being supervised 100%. Last year they played pod casts during lunch, which seemed to work well. This year it seems like they are watching TV, not as good.
- Each classroom handles lunch differently. It is up to the teacher for each class.

**8. Masks**

1. There are thousands of masks available at the school. These are provided by the TDSB. There are some that are preferred and are not always available. Types of masks, 4 sizes of masks. Disposable masks.
2. Which types of masks are the ones that are available: all black masks not all the same types of the masks.
3. Back-up masks – they are not medical grade. Just masks.
